Problem 1. The final exam will be comprehensive, that is, it will cover the material of the whole semester.

- (a) Do the practice problems for both midterms.

**Problem 2.** For  $t \ge 0$  and  $x \in [0,4]$ , consider the heat flow problem:  $\begin{aligned} u_t &= 2u_{xx} + e^{-x/2} \\ u_x(0,t) &= 3 \\ u(4,t) &= -2 \\ u(x,0) &= f(x) \end{aligned}$ 

Determine the steady-state solution and spell out equations characterizing the transient solution.

**Problem 3.** Using a step size of  $h = \frac{1}{2}$ , discretize the Dirichlet problem  $\begin{array}{l}
u_{xx} + u_{yy} = 0 \\
u(x,0) = 3 \\
u(x,2) = 5 \\
u(0,y) = 1 \\
u(1,y) = 2
\end{array}$ 

Spell out a system of linear equations for the resulting lattice points. Do not solve that system.

(Note that, for the Dirichlet problem as well as for our discretization, it doesn't matter that the boundary conditions aren't well-defined at the corners.)

Problem 4. Find all eigenfunctions and eigenvalues of

$$y'' + \lambda y = 0, \quad y'(0) = 0, \quad y(3) = 0.$$

**Problem 5.** Find the solution u(x, t), for 0 < x < 3 and  $t \ge 0$ , to the heat conduction problem

$$2u_t = u_{xx}, \quad u_x(0,t) = 0, \ u(3,t) = 0, \quad u(x,0) = 2\cos\left(\frac{\pi x}{2}\right) + 7\cos\left(\frac{3\pi x}{2}\right).$$

Derive your solution using separation of variables (at some step you may refer to the EVP above).

**Problem 6.** Find the solution u(x, y), for 0 < x < 3 and 0 < y < 2, to

$$u_{xx} + u_{yy} = 0, \quad u(x,0) = 0, \quad u(x,2) = 0, \quad u(0,y) = \sin(\pi y) + 2\sin(7\pi y), \quad u(3,y) = 0.$$

Derive your solution using separation of variables.
